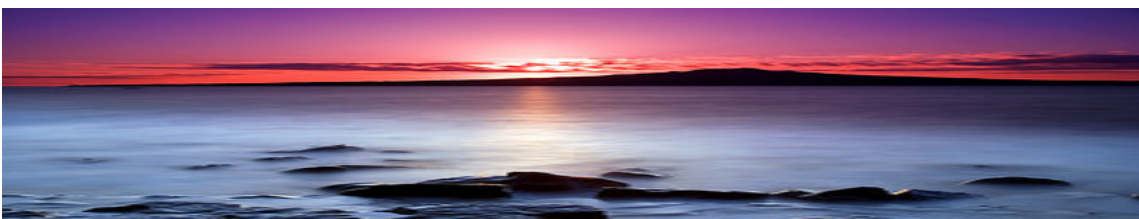

Gordon McNair

Gordon McNair is the Service manager/Head Biomedical Scientist in the Cellular and Molecular Pathology Department of the Northern Health and Social Care Trust, the second largest Trust in Northern Ireland.



Gordon is based at Antrim hospital where Biomedical Scientist do over 90% of the cutup. He has been involved in specimen dissection since 1985 and dissects all categories of specimens including major cancer resections. Gordon lecture's on the principles and practice of cutup, on the Institute of Biomedical Science (IBMS) approved courses at the two local universities, the University of Ulster Coleraine; and Queens University Belfast. He is a member of their Employee Liaison Groups

He is heavily involved in the Institute of Biomedical Science has been a member for nearly thirty years, served on the Northern Ireland Branch Committee since 2005, Chairperson from 2008 to earlier this year. Gordon is an assessor for the IBMS certificate of competence which leads to registration with the Health Professional Council.

Gordon is the Irish Regional elected member on the IBMS UK national council a position he has held since 2007. As a national council member he has been heavily involved in the Modernising Scientific Careers project which proposes major changes to Healthcare Science throughout the UK.

He is Chairperson of the Royal College of Pathologists / Institute of Biomedical Science advanced Histodissection subgroup which has developed a training programme and an Advanced Specialist Diploma in Specimen Dissection. The first two programmes are now completed Breast Pathology and Lower Gastrointestinal Pathology with the first examinations held in September 2011. Other programmes will be developed in the next few years.

Gordon has recently become a Clinical Pathology Accreditation (CPA) Peer Assessor who supports the CPA Regional Assessor to assess the competence of Medical Laboratories in the public and independent sector

Carol Turnbull

Carol is the clinical lead in the Belfast trust in specimen dissection where she has been dissecting all specimen categories for over 25 years. She manages the training and supervision of staff who wish to follow this career path. Together with the consultant medical staff, she works closely with the junior medical staff advising on block selection and governance issues.



Carol has a post graduate diploma in health and social care management PGDip HSCM and was the first person in Ireland to be awarded the diploma of expert practice in histological dissection. Carol was invited to Downing Street to participate in a UK wide publication for "extraordinary you". This was to raise the profile of the role of healthcare scientists throughout the UK. She was selected from hundreds of applicants to be part of this extraordinary event. The 60 people selected were highlighting the various roles within healthcare and particularly individuals who were pushing boundaries within their own profession.
